The MGHNAA Grant was awarded during Nurses' Week. The MGH's Munn Center for Nursing Research has announced that in honor of the 150th anniversary of the MGH SON, it will sponsor, from their own funds, a second award, matching NAA grant criteria, amount and term. Both awards will be called the MGHNAA Grant. They are thrilled to be partnering with us and to be celebrating the 150th birthday of the school in this way. The Center reports that the MGHNAA research grant is the most popular, sought after research award by nurses at MGH, with more proposals (5) received than any other grant in any other year. Award: Noted in Today's Vitals, the Mass General Brigham employee newsletter, for 5/15/2023. "The US Department of Labor announced more than \$78 million in grants to support workforce training programs in 17 states and address staffing challenges nursing professionals face in the care economy. The MGH Institute of Health Professions received the second largest award in the country, at \$5.8 million. The grant will help the IHP expand the pipeline of qualified nursing professionals, with the goal of supporting workforce needs across our system. By leveraging federal funds to address staffing needs, the IHP will help to strengthen Mass General Brigham's ability to provide excellent care for patients."
