

This is a momentous time and a momentous event for the MGH Nurses' Alumni Association, MGH Nursing, and the MGH Institute of Health Professions School of Nursing. The MGH School of Nursing, founded in 1873, closed its doors in 1981 with a profound history having trained and educated close to 8,000 nurses caring for patients worldwide. It is a truly remarkable history of advancing patient care, nursing education, and professional nursing. Every graduate of the school is a part of and a tribute to this heritage. The celebration will not be the same without you!!!

MGH President **Dr. Peter Slavin** has announced his intention to retire after 18 years as president and 40 years of association with the hospital beginning with his medical residency. He will continue to serve until a replacement is appointed. This news follows the earlier announcement by Mass General Brigham (nee Partners Health Care) that it will aggressively pursue the total merger of the two institutions with decision-making powers resting within the corporation rather than the hospitals.

Access to the hospital will continue to be restricted until at least the fall of 2021. Venues such as the Russell Museum are closed for the duration, but their Facebook page, https://www.facebook.com/mghrussellmuseum/ presents unusual and interesting medically-related facts in a regular squib called, "Your Medical Museum at Home."

The School of Nursing has named its new Dean, **Dr. Kenneth R. White**, beginning July 1, 2021. Dr. White's BSN, MSN, and PhD were completed at Virginia Commonwealth University. He holds a Master of Public Health degree in health administration from the University of Oklahoma and a Post-MS Certificate as an Adult/ Gerontology Acute Care Nurse Practitioner. In his work as a certified nurse practitioner, he worked in the areas of hospice and palliative care.

Most recently, he completed service as the Associate Dean for Strategic Partnerships in the School of Nursing and Endowed Professor of Nursing at the University of Virginia and continues in that affiliation as an emeritus

professor. He also held joint appointments with the Darden School of Business, the McIntire School of Commerce, and the School of Medicine. Earlier in his career Dr. White was an executive with the Mercy Health System, an international provider of health care. During his tenure with the Mercy System, he led the civilian hospital on Guam and served in various administrative roles with Mercy Health Center in Oklahoma City.

Dr. White has published many refereed articles, as well as chapters and texts on several areas important to the practice of nursing including: intensive, palliative, and hospice care; nursing entrepreneurship; the evolution of Catholic health systems; and many areas of hospital leadership and management. Later this year, Dr. White will begin a two-year term as the President of the American Academy of Nursing, an organization with which he has been actively involved for years.

History/Archives News

The work of transcribing completed oral histories is nearing completion; it offers a rich trove of lived history and anecdotes in both audio and written formats. When finished they will be in permanent, uniform formats (digital and written hard copies). Their ultimate destination will be the MGH Archives with the rest of the nursing artifacts for long-term storage and availability for research.

We recently discovered that the oral history one of our graduates, **Mary Pickering Barker**, class of 1916, had been recorded by the University of California in 1965. In it she talks about her work at UCSF (she was an organizer of the collegiate nursing program there in 1927) and reminisces about her student days at MGH. She lived in England after her marriage in 1934. A major project for the foreseeable future will be planning for the 2023 celebration of the 150th anniversary of our founding. Several sub-committees are working on this including a Video Committee which is researching and organizing a video about the school and its graduates; a group working on a physical memorial to Ruth Sleeper and the MGH SON nurses, and others culling through transcribed histories and issues of the *Quarterly Record* for interesting anecdotes and quotes. We look forward to being able to access the archives in person again to dig deeper into the history.



Born in Amesbury, MA, Marlene graduated from Massachusetts General Hospital School of Nursing in 1953. She worked in Boston, San Francisco, and Lakeland before settling on the Suncoast of Florida. Her career at Venice Community Hospital began in 1971 and she rose to manage a 45-bed floor before retiring in 1994. She studied nights to earn a Bachelor of Science in Management from Nova University in 1987. She left medicine to work in administration at her husband's construction company. She is survived by her husband of 64 years, Daniel, her three sons and extended family. She was ac-

tive in her church, volunteering in several community service activities through them. Her pleasures included ballroom dancing, world travel, aerobics, and lunches with her dear friends, the "Gabby Girls."
